On February 3, 2011, the undersigned entered Findings of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Final Order on Hearing (Final Order), which was subsequently served on February 7, in the above referenced matter. Said Final Order set aside the Insurance Commissioner's (OIC) Order Revoking License, which revoked the insurance producer's license of Lyle Glen Wallace, based upon Findings of Facts and Conclusions of Law set forth therein.

On February 11, 2011, the OIC filed its Motion for Reconsideration of Final Order on Hearing, requesting that the undersigned revise her Final Order to condition her vacation of the license revocation upon Mr. Wallace promptly submitting a legible fingerprint card to the OIC. The OIC bases its request on the fact that the OIC has yet to receive a legible fingerprint card from Mr. Wallace and therefore has yet to obtain the criminal history background information contemplated by this statute. The OIC asserts that as presently worded, the Final Order allows Mr. Wallace to continue selling insurance without requiring him to provide the OIC staff with

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the legible fingerprint card the OIC staff needs in order to enforce RCW 48.17.090(1) concerning submitting fingerprints of applicants to the Washington state patrol and other entities for a state and national criminal history background check.


The OIC's request is reasonable and should be granted. Upon entry of the Final Order, the undersigned assumed that since the date of the hearing herein Mr. Wallace had submitted his fingerprints to allow the OIC to perform the investigation. Because apparently this is not the case, the Final Order herein should be revised as requested by the OIC.

Based upon the above activity,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Findings of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Final Order on Hearing shall be amended to read:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Insurance Commissioner's Order Revoking License, No. 10-0076, to the effect that the insurance producer's license of Lyle Glen Wallace is revoked, is hereby set aside on the condition that the OIC receive a legible fingerprint card from Mr. Wallace by close of business on March 3, 2011. If 1) the OIC does not receive said fingerprint card by March 3, 2011; or 2) the OIC receives a letter by either mail or email from Mr. Wallace stating that he no longer wishes to apply for an insurance producer's license in Washington, then the OIC's Order Revoking License shall become effective as of that date without further right of Mr. Wallace to appeal said Order.


