In reading this filing I will respond to each of the Roman Numeral statements that the OIC has filed in this draft.

2. I agree that I did receive the email and mail that was dated November 4th, 2014. I do believe the hearings unit received my grievance on February 4th as I made sure it was delivered 3 months after November 4th. As a lay person I would argue that most people who see the term 90 days understand it is in essence 3 months. I do not work in the legal field and was not in a position to hire counsel. That was my understanding, and that is why I made sure it was delivered on February 4th. The fact that two of the months had 31 days did not cross my mind and it seems drastic to be removed from the due process of a hearing just because of that.

3. The statement that "the insurance code is particularly lenient" is really irrelevant. If the amount of days had been 30 or 60 I would have made sure my grievance was filed by then.
