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I was told that if my felony conviction was more than 10 years old, and it is over 20 years old, that I would be allowed to have my insurance license if I passed the schooling and passed my life insurance license examination. I successfully completed both and received a 96% on the insurance examination on December 5, 2014.


I am disabled and on kidney dialysis three days a week. This only allows me to work 4 days a week, which I am happy to do. I have tried to get many jobs in the recent past since being released from prison but no one will hire me because I can not work full time. Insurance is the only thing that I can find that will allow me to work part time and still be able to make a living. I can hardly walk because I have severe neuropathy in my feet as well as in my hands and this limits me to things that I can do to make a living.

I very much need to have the denial of my license overturned so that I may be allowed to make a living and not be on assistance any longer.

My parole officer, Mr. Ethan Green, has written a letter to the insurance commissioner suggesting that I am not a risk to the community and that I have a low risk of re-offending. I have also furnished many letters attesting to my character for some 30 years from family and friends.

Please contact me in the near future to schedule a hearing for reversal of the commissioner's denial of my life insurance license.
