On June 15, 2006, Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada (SLACC), by and through Christopher L. Keenan, U.S. Law Department of Sun Life Financial, requested a hearing and that a recommended decision first be entered by an administrative law judge from the Office of Administrative Hearings. SLACC's request for hearing objected to the Insurance Commissioner's (OIC) May 23, 2006 Consent Order Imposing a Fine, No. D06-205 and the OIC's actions associated with that order. On June 15, 2006, this matter was transferred to the Office of Administrative Hearings for review. The Insurance Commissioner appeared pro se by and through Marcia Stickler, Staff Attorney for Legal Affairs.



FINAL ORDER TERMINATING PROCEEDING
NO. D06-205
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Prior to any hearings, a settlement was reached and on August 25, 2006, and September 5, 2006, a Revised Consent Order Imposing a Fine was fully executed. A copy of the order is attached hereto and is by this reference incorporated herein. On September 14, 2006, a faxed memo was received from Lynn M. Kelley of Sun Life Financial stating that the company no longer requires a hearing. On October 30, 2006, an Initial Order Dismissing Proceeding Due to Withdrawal was entered by Selwyn S.C. Walters, Senior Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings. Accordingly, the hearings file was transferred to the undersigned to enter a Final Order.

IMPOSING A FINE

Findings of Fact:

1. Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada ("Sun Life") is authorized to conduct insurance business in Washington State. It issues life and disability insurance.
2. Sun Life completed filing its calendar year 2005 Annual Statement and its 2005 April Supplemental filing on April 28, 2006.
3. The April Supplemental filing is a required annual statement supplement per the *National Association of Insurance Commissioners' Quarterly and Annual Statement Filing Instructions*. The Washington Office of the Insurance Commissioner ("OIC") also posts Annual Statement Filing Instructions on its website that indicate that this filing is due by April 1 of the following calendar year. AC 284-07-050 requires adherence to these filing instructions.

Conclusions of Law:

1. Sun Life's failure to timely file its calendar year 2005 Annual Statement and 2005 April Supplemental filing constitutes two violations of RCW 48.05.250.
2. RCW 48.05.185 authorizes the Commissioner to impose a fine in lieu of or in addition to the suspension or revocation of an insurer's certificate of authority.


Consent to Order:

Sun Life consents to the following, in order to resolve this matter without further legal or administrative proceedings. The Insurance Commissioner consents to resolve this matter in consideration of the insurer's payment of a fine as set forth below.

1. Sun Life consents to the entry of the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and acknowledges its duty to comply fully with all applicable laws and regulations of the State of Washington. It waives further administrative or legal challenge to the actions taken, or to be taken, by the Insurance Commissioner, related to the subject matter of this Order.
2. Within thirty days of the entry of this Order, Sun Life will pay to the Insurance Commissioner a fine in the amount of \$1,125 (one thousand one hundred twenty five dollars).
3. Failure to pay the fine in full within thirty days of the entry of this order will constitute grounds for revocation of the certificate of authority held by Sun Life in Washington State. It will also result in a civil action being brought by the Attorney General on behalf of the Insurance Commissioner, to recover the fine.


Pursuant to the foregoing Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Consent to Order, the Insurance Commissioner orders as follows:

Order:

1. Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada is ordered to pay, within thirty days of the entry of this order, a fine in the amount of \$1,125 (one thousand one hundred twenty five dollars).
2. Failure to pay the fine timely and in full will constitute grounds for revocation of the certificate of authority held by Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada in Washington State. It will also result in a civil action being brought by the Attorney General on behalf of the Insurance Commissioner, to recover the fine.
