**ORDER ON FIRST PREHEARING
CONFERENCE**

Kirsten Molbak Paterson has appealed the revocation of her license to sell life and disability insurance. Separately, her husband Robert Paterson has appealed the revocation of his license to sell life and disability insurance. Because of the essential unity of facts, witnesses, and parties, these two matters have been consolidated for hearing. Administrative Law Judge Robert C. Krabill held a telephonic Prehearing Conference in this matter on August 7, 2007. The Licensees appeared by and through Timothy J. Parker. The Commissioner appeared by and through Charles D. Brown.

AGREEMENTS

In conference with me, the parties agreed to the following:

1. **NO ADDITIONAL PREHEARING CONFERENCE:** No other legal matters

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are pending that might delay, interfere, or prejudice a hearing on the merits. No further prehearing conference is required.

2. **IN PERSON HEARING:** The hearing in this matter will begin on **SEPTEMBER 25, 2007, AT 9:30 AM** Pacific time. It is scheduled for two days. The second day will be **SEPTEMBER 27, 2007, AT 10:30 AM** Pacific time, if necessary. The hearing will take place in person at the Office of Administrative Hearings in Olympia, Washington. A separate Notice of Hearing will be issued specifying the street address of the hearing room.

3. **CONTINUANCES:** Any party may request a delay ("continuance") of the foregoing hearing date; however, no continuances will be granted except upon good cause shown. WAC 10-08-090. **DO NOT ASSUME** that your continuance request has been granted, until the Office of Administrative Hearings notifies you the hearing has been continued.

4. **ISSUES:** Whether the Commissioner properly revoked Ms. Paterson's license to sell life and disability insurance. Whether the Commissioner properly revoked Mr. Paterson's license to sell life and disability insurance. If the Commissioner establishes violations by one or both of the Licensees, the issues include whether revocation is the proper sanction for those violations. The hearing in this matter will be limited to these issues, unless the issues are modified at a later prehearing conference.

5. **WITNESS LISTS:** If a party intends to call witnesses to testify, that party must prepare a witness list. If a party intends to present any witness by telephone rather than in person, that party should so specify in its witness list. Each party will be responsible for providing a telephone number at which those witnesses appearing by telephone can be contacted at the time of the hearing. The parties must mail their witness lists by September 18, 2007. Witnesses not named in a timely mailed witness list may be excluded from testifying.

6. **EXHIBIT LISTS:** If a party intends to introduce documents as evidence (known as "exhibits"), that party must provide the other party one full set of those documents and another to the Office of Administrative Hearings. The party proposing an exhibit should mark each page in the lower right hand corner with an exhibit number and page number. The Commissioner should begin with Exhibit 1 and continue upward sequentially, and the Licensees should begin with Exhibit A and continue onward alphabetically. Along with copies of proposed exhibits, the proposing party must include an exhibit list. The parties must mail their exhibit lists by September 18, 2007. The administrative law judge may reject any documents not properly filed by the exhibit list deadline.

7. **FILING DOCUMENTS:** Filing requires mailing to both the Office of

Administrative Hearings and the other party. To ensure that documents are placed with the proper file, the parties should include the docket number on any documents sent to the Office of Administrative Hearings. Do not mail documents to the street address, because the postal service will not deliver mail to the street address.

8. **CONTACT INFORMATION:** The parties must update the Office of Administrative Hearings with any changes to their addresses or telephone numbers.


ORDER
