
I am requesting a hearing in response to the order to revoke my license. In the 2 plus years since the findings against me in the prior matter, I have been careful to avoid conflict with any of the restrictions placed upon me and complied with the stipulations as set forth in the agreement.

At no time since the cancellation of my appointment with Mutual of Omaha have I presented myself as a representative of Mutual of Omaha. As instructed, I have referred all matters concerning Mutual of Omaha to an appointed agent or to their home office.

I have filled out numerous applications for appointments with insurers in the past 3 years. Most have been accepted and some have been denied but I have not knowingly submitted any false information.

I have at no time willfully violated any provision of the code or the Commissioner's order. I have at no time intended to deceive or misrepresent myself to any client or prospective client. I strongly refute the charge that I am incompetent, untrustworthy, or a source of injury or loss to the public. If that were true, I would not be able to continue to grow my business without prospecting, but only through referrals from clients of family members and friends who wish me to represent their loved ones.
