

PLLC in Seattle, filed his Notice of Appearance on behalf of the Licensee. Accordingly, on September 30 the undersigned held a first prehearing conference herein, and by agreement of the parties the hearing was scheduled to commence on February 9, 2009.

Thereafter, on January 28, 2009 the parties jointly requested a continuance until April 15, which was granted. On March 27, the parties jointly requested a second continuance until July 8, which was granted. The parties' basis for these requests was that they were attempting to settle this matter. On June 4, the Licensee requested a third continuance of several months on the basis that he had not had time to prepare his case, believing that a settlement would be reached; at that time the Licensee was granted a continuance until July 20.

On July 20 and 21, 2009 the hearing was held as scheduled, and was held thereafter on August 10, 11 and 13 at the request of the Licensee. Subsequent days were then scheduled, by agreement of the parties for September 23, 24 and 28 if needed. In support of his request to continue the hearing date from August 14 to September 23, the Licensee volunteered to have his insurance agent's license suspended and, accordingly, on September 2 the undersigned entered an Order Suspending Agent's License of John A. Hanley, d/b/a Jurisco.

On September 21, 2009, both parties filed a Stipulation to Continue Hearing, requesting a continuance of the September 23 hearing date until October 26, to continue on consecutive week days excluding Fridays, until terminated. The parties asserted that they wished to try again to attempt to reach a settlement of this matter, that they wished to meet to discuss Mr. Hanley's position as to bond amounts allegedly owed, and that they had discussed the outlines of an agreement they wished further time to pursue.


Accordingly, the undersigned requested written confirmation from both parties that they were in compliance with the abovereferenced September 2 Order Suspending Agent's License. When the written communication from the Licensee was unclear, the undersigned scheduled a teleconference to discuss the parties' compliance with the Order. Said teleconference was held commencing at 10:00 a.m. on September 23, 2009. The teleconference included Alan Singer and Mike DeLeo. The Insurance Commissioner adequately detailed his compliance with the Order. Given the written statement of the Licensee in response to request for confirmation of his compliance with the Order, and given the Licensee's oral statements and his responses to followup questions during the September 23 teleconference, it is unclear whether the Licensee is in compliance with the Order.

Based, upon the parties' Stipulation to Continue Hearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the hearing in this matter is continued from September 23, 2009 until 10:00 a.m. on Monday, October 26, 2009, in the Office of the Insurance Commissioner 5000 Capital Blvd., Tumwater Washington, and shall continue on consecutive week days following October 26, 2009 excluding Fridays, until terminated.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, as set forth in the September 2, 2009 Order Suspending Agent's License, the insurance agent's license of the John A. Hanley d/b/a Jurisco continues to be suspended, with the resulting requirements set forth in said Order Suspending Agent's License, until either 1) the hearing continues and Final Findings of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Final Order after hearing is entered by the undersigned which either upholds, sets aside or modifies the Insurance Commissioner's Order Revoking License; or 2) an Order Terminating Proceeding based upon settlement of the parties is entered by the undersigned.
