WAC 284-13-539(3)(b)(viii)	Does the applicant jurisdiction have similar relevant international standards or guidance with respect to mutual recognition of reinsurance supervision adopted by the International Association of Insurance Supervisors or successor organization?		
WAC 284-13-539(3)(b)(ix)	The Commissioner may consider in determining whether to recognize a qualified jurisdiction any other matters deemed relevant.
